### **Programs and Pathways**



# Financial Summary 2021-2022






# Service Territory

# According to a 2022 third-party study of JA alums conducted by Ipsos:

- Ninety percent of JA alums say it exposed them to different ways of thinking, 89% say it motivated them to succeed in their professional lives, and 88% say JA widened their horizons.
- More than half (56%) say they are currently in a career or job, or have worked in a similar position, to the one their JA volunteer had.
- Strong majorities of JA alums report that JA played an important role in believing they can achieve their goals (90%), their personal development (87%), and gave them confidence in new situations (85%).

Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion

Junior Achievement addresses the opportunity gap and systemic disparities for students through access to quality educational opportunities and resources, with a focus on career exploration, leadership and life skills, and financial literacy. Our organization emphasizes solutions that help break the poverty cycle and achieve lasting, positive change. Junior Achievement takes three approaches to help address economic inequity:

- 1) Increase financial security through financial literacy
- 2) Narrow the income gap through career and work readiness
- 3) Level the playing field through entrepreneurship

JA programs are proven to give students the tools they need to increase their chances of achieving economic security as adults. These skills will not only improve young people's lives, but they will also bolster their families, their communities, and our nation.

## Program Highlights



Through partnerships with schools, businesses, and community organizations, we connect young people to role models, resources, and real-world experiences.

#### **Manufacturing Career Awareness Seminar:**

In October 2021, JA hosted our first annual Manufacturing Career Awareness Seminar in partnership with The WorkPlace. Local high school students heard from various manufacturing leaders in our state, including ManufactureCT, Sikorsky, and Bigelow Tea about this high-growth industry. Participants also had the chance to ask questions about potential career opportunities.

Financial Literacy Day: In April 2022, all ninth and tenth grade students in Stratford participated in our annual Financial Literacy Day, where students explored the true cost of car ownership. With the help of their JA business volunteers from JPMorgan Chase, students calculated the monthly expenses associated with owning a car and made financial planning decisions based on their findings.


